Tustin resident named Rotary's Community Leader of the Year

Jim Palmer, Tustin resident and President of the Orange County Rescue Mission, has been awarded a prestigious award by Rotary International's District 5320, representing 2,000 Rotarians from Orange County and Southern Los Angeles County. At the Rotary's District Conference, Jim Palmer was named Community Leader of the Year by

Rotary Governor, Grant Engle. The Award is given once a year to the person who is of good moral character, practices high ethical standards, is a community leader and has an excellent business and professional reputation.

Governor Engle said that "Jim Palmer best exemplifies the 4-Way Test of Rotary which is (1) Is it the truth?; (2)

Is it fair to all concerned?; (3) Is it beneficial to all concerned?; and (4) Will it build good will and better friendship?" Governor Engle said that the 2,000 rotary members are all asked to submit nominees for this prestigious award. Jim Palmer's nomination was submitted by the Rotary Club of Tustin.

Local teen earns Eagle Scout honor



Wyatt Frederic Fry, 18, has earned the rank of Eagle, the highest achievement awarded by the Boy Scouts of America. An Eagle Court of Honor will be held on May 27 at Trinity United Presbyterian Church, Santa Ana, to recognize his achievement.

Wyatt started his scouting career in Cub Scouts with Pack 235 in 1995, bridged to Boy Scout Troop 235 in June 1998, and transferred to Troop 323 in August 1998, where he has served in various leadership positions, including, Assistant Patrol Leader, Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior

Patrol Leader, Chaplain Aide, and Senior Patrol Leader. In 2000 he was inducted into scouting's honor society, the Order of the Arrow, has served as Vice-Chief of Service, and was awarded the Brotherhood honor in 2001. In addition to earning 31 merit badges Wyatt has camped over 90 nights. A highlight of his scouting experience was a 60-mile backpacking trek at the Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico. He participated in the 12-day trek with several boys and leaders from his troop in the summer of 2003.

Wyatt's Eagle Scout project

involved building a custom designed unit of adjustable shelves and locking cupboards in the garage of Mary's Shelter, a home for pregnant minors in North Tustin. The project required nearly 450 hours and involved 62 volunteer scouts, friends, and adults to complete. He raised funds by holding a garage sale; requesting donations from friends, relatives, and businesses; and asking suppliers for discounts on needed materials. The contributions received exceeded project costs and made it possible for Wyatt to award Mary's Shelter the excess funds

that amounted to over \$1000.

Wyatt, the son of Robin and Fred Fry of Tustin, is a senior at the Orange County High School of the Arts in the Instrumental Music (Piano) Department. As an active member of Trinity United Presbyterian Church he volunteers as a sound technician and participates in numerous youth activities, including choir and mission trips to Mexico. He is enrolled in honors classes at Santiago Canyon College for the fall semester, and is continuing his association with Troop 323 as an Assistant Scoutmaster.
